PRESENTATIONS

Mayor Sheldon called for presentations. Ms. Carter asked Council to not forget about the need for tornado sirens on the Beach.

<u>Frank Sewell</u> – Mr. Sewell discussed Bill 620 that would allow certain businesses to file lawsuits against local governments for loss of revenues.

ITEM 2. ORDINANCE NO. 1580, REQUEST TO ANNEX 3.4009 ACRES LOCATED AT THE NORTH END OF MOONLIGHT BAY DRIVE, SECOND READING / PUBLIC HEARING.

ITEM 3. ORDINANCE NO. 1581, SMALL SCALE FUTURE LAND USE MAP AMENDMENT LOCATED AT THE NORTH END OF MOONLIGHT BAY DRIVE, SECOND READING / PUBLIC HEARING.

Mayor Sheldon introduced Mrs. Amy Myers, City Attorney. Mrs. Myers read Ordinance 1581 by title only. Mayor Sheldon opened the public hearing. Hearing and seeing no comments, Mayor Sheldon closed the public hearing. Mayor Sheldon invited comment from Director Leonard. Director Leonard reported that this request was for a small-scale future land use map amendment, a portion of the previous request. Director Leonard added that the parcel would go to single family residential. Director Leonard reported that the Planning Board recommended approval. ITEM 4. ORDINANCE NO. 1582, ZONING MAP DESIGNATION LOCATED AT THE NORTH END OF MOONLIGHT BAY DRIVE, SECOND READING / PUBLIC HEARING, QUASI-JUDICIAL HEARING.

Mayor Sheldon introduced Mrs. Amy Myers, City Attorney. Mrs. Myers read Ordinance 1582 by title only. Mayor Sheldon announced that this was a hearing concerning the request filed by CADH, LLC to zone property located at the eastern terminus of Moonlight Bay Drive to R-1A (Single Family Residential, Low Density). Mayor Sheldon reported that at the first reading of this Ordinance, Council approved a zoning of this land to R-1A.

Mayor Sheldon informed everyone that the purpose of the hearing was to provide a proceeding whereby the person requesting approval of the rezoning, and other interested parties, could present their cases in support or in opposition to the application.

Mayor Sheldon further reported that the Council would make a decision based upon what it sees and hears at tonight's hearing. Mayor Sheldon informed everyone that this would be a somewhat informal hearing and that Council Members may ask questions of anybody during, or after, each presentation. Mayor Sheldon added that each party would have an opportunity to ask questions of the testifying party at the conclusion of that person's testimony.

Mayor Sheldon further announced that if the Council makes a decision on the matter this evening, the decision would be reduced to writing and interested or adversely affected parties would have 30-days from the issuance of the Order to appeal to the Circuit Court.

Mayor Sheldon asked Council members to make Jennings Disclosure. Councilman Jarman reported he had nothing to disclose. Vice Mayor McConnell reported he had no Jennings disclosure. Councilman Chester reported that he knew where the property was located and he had talked with staff about the property. Councilman Casto reported that he had not talked with anyone about the property. Mayor Sheldon reported that he had not talked with anyone about the property.

City Attorney Myers swore in witnesses.

Mayor Sheldon invited Director Leonard to the podium. Director Leonard reported that the hearing was properly noticed. Director Leonard reported that the staff recommended that the property go to a R1A zoning and that the Planning Board recommended approval to go to R1A at its February meeting. Director Leonard entered a packet of information into the record with the City Clerk, including the application and the City Council memo. Mayor Sheldon thanked Director Leonard.

Mayor Sheldon invited the Applicant or Applicant's representative to address Council. Hearing and seeing none. Mayor Sheldon inquired if there were any adversely affected parties who wished to present evidence or testimony objecting to this request. Hearing and seeing none. Mayor Sheldon opened the public hearing. Hearing and seeing no comments, Mayor Sheldon closed the public hearing. Mayor Sheldon asked Mrs. Myers if she had anything to add. Mrs. Myers did not.

Mayor Sheldon noted this item was available to Council and noted Council would begin its deliberations. Hearing and seeing no comments from Council, Councilman Casto moved to approve the zoning as stated. Councilman Jarman seconded the motion. Hearing and seeing no further discussion, all were in favor of approval of the zoning by a roll call vote (5-0).

Mayor Sheldon introduced Mrs. Amy Myers, City Attorney. Mrs. Myers read Resolution 22-110 by title only. Mayor Sheldon called for public comments. Hearing and seeing none, Mayor Sheldon closed public comments. Mayor Sheldon invited comment from City Manager Whitman. Manager Whitman reported that it was important to the community to get the CRA project completed. Manager Whitman added that the City could control the costs of this interim contract by the number of hours the consultant worked and the scope of work.
