#### ORDINANCE NO. 1651

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PANAMA CITY BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 7-3 OF THE CITY'S CHARTER RELATED TO THE CONDUCT OF MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 2-16 OF THE CITY'S CODE RELATED TO THE DATE OF THE CITY'S NOVEMBER COUNCIL MEETINGS DURING ELECTION YEARS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; SCRIVENER'S ERRORS; LIBERAL INTERPRETATION; MODIFICATIONS; CODIFICATION; EFFECT ON EXISTING TERMS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PANAMA CITY BEACH, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. From and after the effective date of this ordinance, Section 7-3 of the City Charter of Panama City Beach City is amended to read as follows (new text **bold and underlined**, deleted text struck through):

### Sec. 7-3. - Conduct, generally.

- (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided by this Charter, all elections held by the City shall be conducted in accordance with all applicable provisions of the Florida Election Code.
- (b) Regular elections for the offices of Mayor and City Councilperson shall be held on the third Tuesday of April after the third Monday of April the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year to coincide with federal, state, and county elections. Each candidate for City Councilperson shall run City-wide. Each candidate for Mayor shall run City-wide. Electors shall be entitled to vote for one candidate from each ward and for one candidate for Mayor. The candidate receiving the highest number of the votes cast for that particular office shall be elected. In the event two or more persons receive an equal and highest number of votes for the same office, such persons shall draw lots to determine who shall be elected to the office.

SECTION 2. From and after the effective date of this ordinance, Section 2-16 of the City's Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows (new text **bold and underlined**, deleted text struck through):

### Sec. 2-16. Meetings.

(a) Except in November and December, the regular meetings of the City Council shall be held on the second Thursday of each month beginning at 6:00 p.m. and the fourth Thursday of each month beginning at 9:00 a.m. in City Hall. In November and December, the regular meeting of the City Council shall be held on the second Thursday beginning

- at 9:00 a.m. and the regular meeting of the City Council scheduled for the fourth Thursday in November and December may be cancelled or rescheduled by the City Council.
- (b) In any year in which a general municipal election is held in the month of November, the City Council shall only conduct one regular meeting which shall be held on the first Thursday following the certification of the election results, unless that day falls on the Thanksgiving holiday, in which case the regular meeting of the City Council shall be held on the second Thursday following the certification of the election results.
- SECTION 3. EFFECT ON EXISTING TERMS. In accordance with section 2-2 of the City Charter, the terms of all members of the City Council affected by this Ordinance shall be extended until each Councilmember's successor is duly elected.
- SECTION 4. CONFLICT WITH OTHER ORDINANCES OR CODES. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances of the Code of Ordinances of Panama City Beach, Florida, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Ordinance is held to be illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the other provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- SECTION 6. SCRIVENER'S ERRORS. It is the intention of the City, and it is hereby provided that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Panama City Beach, Florida, and to that end, the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section" or "article" or other appropriate designation. Additionally, corrections of typographical errors which do not affect the intent of this Ordinance may be authorized by the City Attorney without public hearing, by filing a corrected or recodified copy with the City Clerk.
- SECTION 7. ORDINANCE TO BE LIBERALLY CONSTRUED. This ordinance shall be liberally construed in order to effectively carry out the purposes hereof which are deemed not to adversely affect public health, safety, or welfare.
- SECTION 8. MODIFICATIONS. It is the intent of the City that the provisions of this ordinance may be modified as a result of considerations that may arise during a public hearing. Such modifications shall be incorporated into the final version of the ordinance adopted by the City.
- SECTION 9. CODIFICATION. The appropriate officers and agents of the City are authorized and directed to codify, include, and publish in electronic format the provisions of this Ordinance within the Panama City Beach Code of Ordinances, and unless a contrary ordinance is adopted within ninety (90) days following such publication, the codification of this Ordinance shall become the final and official record of the matters herein ordained. Section numbers may be assigned and changed whenever necessary or convenient.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage.
